President's Report

Perhaps by now you have seen some of the master plan for Peterson Plaza, the City Hall development planned for the lot previously occupied by the hospital. KACC hosted a meeting sponsored by the Cailloux Foundation on June 16 where plans were presented to the City Council and departments and local business owners. The design has vision and a lot of practical aspects that will make the area amenable to diversified usage.

This development will make KACC more visible from Highway 16 and allow easier access to our facility from the parking garage. The access from the parking garage to Peterson Plaza will be a major factor in the success of the endeavor and will receive a lot of publicity as construction progresses. As an anchor in this block of renovation we need to be mindful of the external appearance of our property and continue to maintain it in an exemplary fashion.

We look forward to site preparation work for the James Avery sculpture towards the end of summer with installation and dedication by mid-November. This watermark event for KACC shows the high regard that we receive from city planners - having been chosen as the first installation site for the Kerrville Main Street Art in public art project.

Our Summer Youth Art program begins on July 11. We have an outstanding faculty teaching both new and old subjects. There may be a few slots open by the time you receive this, so call quickly to make reservations. We also welcome any student or adult helpers who would like to assist with the program.

Last year many of you responded to my plea for help running the "mundane" of our organization and we thank you for your generosity! Exciting and Historical Exhibit Added to 2011 Exhibit Schedule

A collection of 40 framed vintage posters bequeathed to the San Antonio Public Library will be on display at KACC August 4 through September 4 in the Cornels Gallery.

Bequeathed to the library by eclectic collector Harry Hertzberg, the collection includes vintage posters designed by leading artists of the day to assist in the war effort.

These works provide a fascinating window into the era and the beginnings of the American effort in support of the war known variously as the "Great War," "the war to end all wars," and "the war to make the world safe for democracy."

This stunning exhibit comes to Kerrville and KACC through an agreement with the Butt Holdsworth Memorial Library. Watch for educational programs related to this exhibit.

Eligibility: *Images* is open to all KACC Full Member levels from individual/family up to gold level. Each member may submit ONE or TWO piece(s). Any original artwork in any medium created within the last two years and not previously shown at KACC, is eligible. Artwork that has been done under instruction or where source photos are not those of the artist, is ineligible. Artwork based on patterns or kits is not permitted.

Entry Fee: \$15 for one entry or \$20 for two. Diptychs and triptychs may be subject to special size limitations, must be priced as one, and must be clearly a single work of art.

Categories: **Note that categories are by genre, not medium.**

They are: Portrait/Figure, Still life/Floral, Landscape/Interior, Animal/Wildlife, Abstract/Non-Representational, 3-Dimensional Artwork, Fine Craft, Photography. Artists will select the category of their entries, however, the judges may re-categorize based on the number of entries.

Armadillo Uprising!

In 2003, KACC caught "Dillo Fever" and artists from all around the Hill Country decorated "Texas Sized" Armadillos for an event that would put KACC on the map.

This summer, the armadillo is on the rise again. August 4 - September 4, KACC is going to display FRESHLY DECORATED DILLOS for sale in a silent auction. Bids may be placed throughout the exhibit.

KACC is calling for two types of DILLO ART. Artists wishing to participate will be provided a 12 X 12 inch canvas for 2-D DILLO THEMED artwork or a cast resin 3-D armadillo. These foot long armadillos are miniatures of the 2003 originals.

2-D artwork must feature the armadillo. 3-D artwork on the cast armadillo may be any theme; however, art or the Hill Country is encouraged. Work must be signed by the artist.

Endowment Giving

There are several ways to make a gift to the KACC endowment. The quickest is of course **cash**. If the company you work for, or retired from has a matching gift program you can increase your gift by filling out the paperwork provided by your company.

A gift of **appreciated securities** can be made to the endowment. You get credit for the value of the security at the time of the gift, and are not hit with any capital gains tax. You must transfer the security in kind, through your broker.

Another way is to open a **donor directed fund** with the Community Foundation, naming KACC as the beneficiary of your fund. Please contact Rick McManigle at the Foundation at 896-8811 for details.

A very popular method is to name KACC in **your will**. You can leave a specific amount, or a percentage of your estate. Your attorney can help with the proper language to ensure your gift goes to the endowment.
